Our Mission

To address barriers to health care access by providing free medical care to the uninsured in Wichita and Sedgwick County, Kansas, while giving medical and pre-medical students the opportunity to serve the community and gain valuable clinical experience.

Diabetes Initiative

We are working to expand the diabetes care available at JayDoc Community Clinic. Our goal is to provide comprehensive diabetes care for our uninsured patients, including testing supplies and medication as well as education.

Women's Health Initiative

Through the Women's Health Initiative at JayDoc Community Clinic, we are currently able to perform Pap smears and colposcopy (a magnified examination performed when a Pap test is abnormal), and we are always working to expand the services available.
