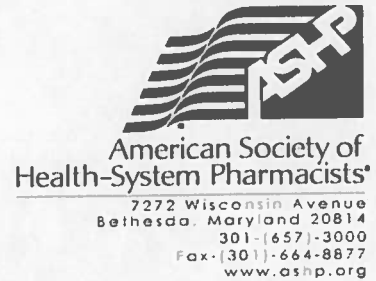

Dear Dr. Audus:

It is a pleasure to inform you of the following action taken at the ASHP Commission on Credentialing meeting on August 13-15, 2012.

VOTED

To approve for reaccreditation the postgraduate year one community pharmacy residency program at the University of Kansas School of Pharmacy and Balls Food Stores, Kansas City, Kansas; further,

To grant accreditation for six years (2018); a midterm progress report will be requested in three years.

(Note: The Commission identified that areas of partial compliance 1, 3, and 4 have been resolved to its satisfaction and no further information needs to be provided in these areas on the next progress report; all other areas of partial compliance should be addressed in the midterm progress report.)

The Commission arrived at its decision based on a thorough review of the report of the survey conducted on April 19, 2012 and your facility's response to the survey findings.

The ASHP Board of Directors reviewed and accepted the Commission on Credentialing's actions on September 21, 2012.

Accreditation is granted subject to the provisions of the *ASHP Regulations on Accreditation of Pharmacy Residencies*.

We congratulate you and the members of your pharmacy staff on receiving accreditation for your Postgraduate Year One (PGY1) Community Pharmacy residency program.
