Notes: Thirty-two students are awarded Rhodes Scholarships each year. Scholarships are allocated in a regional grouping scheme, so the chance of winning a scholarship varies by state. Kansas is in District 12 with Arkansas, Mississippi, Missouri, and South Carolina for 2013. There are 16 districts, each with two scholarships. Institution comparisons are difficult as universities in states with fewer institutions offer a better chance for selection. Applicants have always been eligible to apply either in their state of residence or the state where they attend college. The award is personal, choosing the strongest two applicants in each district, regardless of the institution they attend.
