BEFORE YOU APPLY

• Select an academic field of study.

If you cannot decide which program you prefer, apply to the KU College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. After you come to KU, you can choose a field of study, or you can change to another KU academic division or professional school if you are eligible.

• Review admission requirements and deadlines on the Admission Options charts.

The requirements for admission and deadlines depend upon

- the KU school and major you choose,
- whether you are a first-year or transfer student,
- the semester you will begin.

• Review the costs for tuition, fees, and living expenses on the enclosure or online at www2.ku.edu/~issfacts/prospective/international.

First-year applicants (freshmen)

may enter programs in these four schools: the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (CLAS); the schools of Architecture, Design, and Planning; Engineering; or Music.

Beyond the first year: Before entering programs in some schools, you must first take required courses in CLAS or another school. You may apply for admission to these professional schools after completing prerequisites. See the **Admission Options charts** (pages 3-5): Allied Health, Business, Education, Journalism and

Mass Communications, Nursing, Pharmacy, and Social Welfare.

HOW TO APPLY

Send the following required materials to the Office of International Undergraduate Admissions by the deadline. Your application will not be reviewed until all materials have been received. Failure to submit a complete application will result in delays.

1. Completed and signed paper or online application form (www2.ku.edu/~issfacts).
2. Nonrefundable application fee of \$75.
3. Official academic transcripts of all secondary and post-secondary studies.
4. See the Admission Options charts for additional required materials for some academic programs.
5. Proof of adequate financial resources to study in the United States if you are on an F-1 or J-1 student visa (see Financial Resource Statement, page 8).
6. Photocopy of biographical page of your passport and, if you are in the U.S., a copy of your immigration documents (e.g., I-20, DS-2019, I-94).
7. To apply for on-campus housing, you must submit a separate application form and fee directly to the KU Department of Student Housing. Applications for housing are online at www.housing.ku.edu. Apply early, as space may be limited.

APPLICATION FEE

The nonrefundable \$75 application fee is payable by check, money order, or online by credit card. Checks must be from a bank with a U.S. affiliate and must show the mailing address of the U.S. bank. Checks should be written to The University of Kansas. There are no waivers of the application fee.

ACADEMIC RECORDS

KU requires official academic records from every secondary and post-secondary educational institution you have attended. **Official transcripts must be mailed in a sealed envelope directly from each school to KU.** All documents must be in the native language of instruction and have English translations. Documents must be original, showing official school seal and signature of administrative official. Your full name must be written on each document. Records should be complete, providing detailed information including dates of enrollment; courses for each term of study; grades earned; and diploma, certificate, or degree completed. The grading scale and number of credit hours attempted should be noted when possible. **All records become the property of KU and will not be returned or forwarded.**

First-year applicants (freshmen) have completed secondary school but have not yet enrolled in a regular session at any college or university. Submit official transcripts, mark sheets, diplomas, certificates, or

official examination results proving completion of secondary education (high school), listing courses taken and grades achieved. Your final high school transcript, examination scores, diploma, or certificate must be presented after you graduate.

Transfer applicants have completed secondary school and have been enrolled in a college or university. Submit official transcripts of all post-secondary-level course work, including college, university, ESL, and/or vocational programs. If you have completed fewer than 24 credit hours (one full year of study), since high school, you also must submit your high school records. **You may not disregard your college record and apply as a freshman first-year student. All post-secondary records must be submitted.**

FINANCIAL RESOURCE STATEMENT

All applicants in F-I or J-I status must submit proof of financial support for the first year of study. Financial documents must be dated and less than 6 months old indicating the type of currency; an English translation of financial documents must be provided. If the bank account is not in the applicant's name, please attach a statement signed by the account holder indicating the relationship to the student for whom the support will be provided. Acceptable financial documentation is described in the Student's Financial Resource section of the application.

If you are in a nonimmigrant status other than F-I or J-I, provide copies of official paperwork to verify your immigration status (I-94, I-797, etc.).

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

We recommend that students take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or International English Language Testing System (IELTS) and submit official

scores when applying to KU. However, these scores are not required for admission. Undergraduates may be admitted with any level of English proficiency. Having TOEFL or IELTS scores will help students to plan for their length of study, if additional ESL courses are required.

After you arrive on campus and before you enroll in KU classes, your English proficiency will be tested by KU's Applied English Center. If you do not meet the KU English requirement on the test, you will be required to enroll in English classes at the Applied English Center for one or more semesters. If your test scores are sufficient, you will enroll in full-time academic courses.

If you have recent TOEFL or IELTS scores (within the past two years) in the ranges below, you may apply for a waiver of the English proficiency examination:

- **TOEFL (paper-based test):**
57 or higher for each section score and 4.5 or higher on the Test of Written English (TWE)
- **CBT (computer-based test):**
23 or higher for each section score and 4.5 or higher on the essay
- **iBT (internet-based test):**
23 or higher for each section score
- **Academic format of the International English Language Testing System (IELTS):**
6.0 or higher for each part and a total score of 6.5

Detailed information about English requirements will be sent to you after you have been admitted, or you may read the policy online at www2.ku.edu/~issfacts.

If you are applying as an undergraduate degree-seeking student and also need intensive English courses, you do not need to make a separate application to study in the Applied English Center. However, application for intensive English study as a

nondegree-seeking student may be made directly to the Applied English Center (see Other KU Offices and Resources, page 4).

TRANSFER CREDIT

Course work completed at an accredited higher education institution outside the U.S. may be considered for transfer credit at KU. For your classes to be evaluated for transfer credit, an official record must be mailed from each school you have attended. SCHOLARSHIPS

KU offers a limited number of partial, merit-based scholarships for new undergraduate international students. However, KU does not offer financial assistance or full scholarships that pay for all expenses.
