PROTECTING THE JAYHAWKS IS A FULL-TIME JOB

Nearly 26,000 students are enrolled on the University of Kansas Lawrence campus. When visitors and staff are included, the Kansas Bureau of Investigation views the campus as the statistical equivalent of a city of 35,000.

The University of Kansas Public Safety Office is composed of men and women dedicated to promoting a safe environment for achieving the mission of the university. The office is divided into three areas:

- POLICE
- SECURITY & EMERGENCY PLANNING
- COMMUNICATIONS & RECORDS

Each area is important in promoting a safe environment for the university, but the police unit is the largest and most visible. Full-time commissioned and state-certified police officers provide a full range of police services to the KU community. Patrol officers, investigators, and community service officers each fill specific roles in providing these services.



POLICE SERVICE AT KU

Police officers at the University of Kansas respond to calls from a diverse university community. They engage in preventive patrol of the campus by foot, bicycle, and vehicle, and enforce state laws, city ordinances, and university regulations. Police officers conduct criminal and traffic investigations, make arrests, prepare legal documentation, and testify in court. Officers also provide security and traffic control at large university events such as commencement and basketball and football games.



EMPLOYMENT BENEFITS

- Four 10-hour shifts per week for officers assigned to the patrol unit.
- Pay increases of 10 percent after one year of successful trainee status.
- Nine paid holidays per year plus a discretionary day of leave.
- Numerous overtime opportunities.
- Immediate accrual of paid vacation and personal sick leave, with availability of sick leave for illness of family members. Vacation leave will increase at 5, 10, and 15 years of service.
- The Kansas police and fire retirement system, through which retirement is available at age 50 with 25 years of service, age 55 with 20 years of service, or age 60 with 15 years of service.
- Your choice of several health, vision, and dental plans.
- Use of university recreational and library facilities.
- A staff tuition assistance program.
- Coca-Cola scholarships to the University of Kansas for children of staff.
- Furnished uniforms and equipment.
