

Environmental Studies Program: Minor Curriculum

The Environmental Studies minor is valuable for students interested in an interdisciplinary understanding of environmental issues and problems. The EVRN minor complements majors in Anthropology, Biology, Economics, Geography, Geology, History, and Political Science, and is invaluable preparation for law school, graduate studies, and careers in public and private environmental work. A minor in Environmental Studies is available to undergraduate students with any other major in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. Students obtaining a BGS degree with one major must complete a minor to satisfy their degree requirements. Students **MUST** work with a Environmental Studies advisor to select coursework for a minor.

Requirements for Completion of a Minor in Environmental Studies at the University of Kansas

General:

- 1) The EVRN Minor will include 18 credit hours with at least 12 of those hours at the 300-level or above.
- 2) At least 12 hours must be junior/senior level courses (numbered 300 and above).
- 3) Students must earn at least a 2.0 GPA in the environmental studies courses.
- 4) Students majoring in environmental studies may not minor in environmental studies.
