Music Education

Graduate level music education study is offered as a Ph.D., a MME, a graduate certification program, and a non-degree seeking program. These degrees/programs allow graduates to obtain higher level leadership positions in the profession. Many teach Music Education at the college/university, junior college, secondary, or elementary level, and/or pursue research. The curriculum's flexibility allows the student and advisor to select a series of courses and other experiences particularly tailored to the student's personal and professional goals.

Music Therapy

Graduate level music therapy study is offered as a Ph.D. in Music Education with emphasis in Music Therapy, a MME with major in Music Therapy, a graduate equivalency program, and a non-degree seeking program. These degrees/programs allow graduates to obtain higher level leadership positions in the profession. Many teach Music Therapy at the college/university level, pursue research, and/or engage in clinical practice. Music Therapy positions are found in a variety of areas such as hospitals, institutions for exceptional children and adults, community mental health facilities, geriatric facilities, and other health or school related settings as well as private practice.
