Highlights for Students in the School of Journalism and Mass Communications

Survey Information

The Graduate and Professional Student Survey (GPSS) was administered online to currently enrolled graduate students in Spring 2005. A link to the survey was emailed to 72 Lawrence and Edwards campus degree-seeking graduate students in the School of Journalism and Mass Communications. We received 26 valid responses, for a response rate of 36.1%.

Not all respondents answered all of the questions. Percentages for each question are based on valid responses.

The survey was developed by the AAU Data Exchange to be administered by member institutions with the intent that the data would be available for comparative analyses.

Overall Satisfaction

Percentage of either Excellent or Very Good Ratings	
87%	Quality of academic experience at KU
83%	Quality of overall experience at KU
65%	Quality of student life experience at KU
Percentage of either Definitely or Probably Ratings	
80%	Likelihood of selecting KU if they were to start their graduate career again

Faculty

Percentage of either Excellent or Very Good Ratings	
72%	Intellectual quality of the faculty
56%	Overall quality of graduate level teaching by faculty
76%	Relationship between faculty and graduate students
Percentage of either Strongly Agree or Agree Ratings	
100%	Faculty members were willing to work with them
8%	There were tensions among faculty that affected students

Percentage of either Excellent or Very Good Ratings	
60%	Intellectual quality of fellow graduate students
72%	Program's ability to integrate recent developments in the field
64%	Overall program quality
60%	Quality of program course work
Percentage of either Strongly Agree or Agree Ratings	
76%	Program content supported their research/professional goals
76%	Program activities fostered a sense of intellectual community

For Those in a Program Requiring a Thesis or Dissertation:

Satisfaction

Percentage of either Very Satisfied or Generally Satisfied Ratings	
100%	Advice received on preparing for candidacy examinations
100%	Advice received on career options within academia
58%	Training in research methods
100%	Advice received on career options outside academia
Percentage of either Strongly Agree or Agree Ratings	
100%	The process of selecting their dissertation committee was satisfactory

Thesis/Dissertation Advisor

86%	Were Very Satisfied or Generally Satisfied with the professional relationship with their thesis/dissertation supervisor
100%	Strongly Agreed or Agreed that their thesis/dissertation advisor, overall, performed the role well
86%	Would Definitely or Probably select the same thesis/dissertation supervisor if they were to start their graduate career again
