

**Students from Seward County
Fall 2007

Lawrence and Medical Center Campuses**

Students from Seward County make an important contribution to KU.

In Fall 2007, KU has **75 students** from Seward County:

- 58 undergraduates
- 17 graduate/first professional students

37% of these students were **minority** students, compared to KU's overall 12.5% minority population.

Of the Lawrence campus undergraduate minority students from Seward County, **60%** were **first generation college** students.

KU supports students from Seward County.

As of October 2007, \$157,000 in federal, state, and institutional grants and scholarships have been awarded on the Lawrence and Medical Center campuses to 36 Seward County students for FY 2008. Included within this total:

- \$60,000 in Pell and other federal grants
- \$51,500 in institutional scholarships
- \$35,000 in KU Tuition and other institutional grants
- \$10,500 in state scholarships and grants

Where are they from?

- Liberal High School – 65 students
- Southwestern Heights High School in Kismet – 4 students

Seward County postsecondary institutions contribute as well.

Of the Fall 2007 KU students, **138** have attended **Seward County Community College** in Liberal.
